







# **GeoLog: successes**

- Readership is diverse
- Regular features 'humanise' science and make the research process accessible
- Collaborations with prominent scientific societies allow us to reach readers outside of our general audience





# GeoLog: challenges

- Greater quantity of guest posts from geoscientists and freelancers needed to maintain content of a high standard
- Regular columns which require specialist knowledge, such as GeoEd and GeoPolicy, are difficult to maintain regularly

- Volunteer bloggers
- Include two long standing blogs with a solid readership
- Collaborations with prominent scientific societies

 Attracting new blogs & guest bloggers for existing blogs




# **Division Blogs: successes**

- Since the launch in 2014 the network has grown quickly
- New divisions added yearly since launch
- Individual divisions have seen great success from having a blog, inc. increased readership of their journals and community engagement



# **Division Blogs: challenges**

Success not uniform across blogs – some significantly outperform others



- Regular posting is the single greatest challenge
- Communication and expectation issues

Comparison of the number of views on each division blog in 2014 to 2015 (blue) and 2015 to 2016 (yellow), correct as of October 2016



# **Final remarks**

- The EGU Blogs provide a platform for online science communication
- Disseminate information to Union members and share science with the public by and large
- Largely volunteer driven
- Posting frequency is a real issue across all blogs in the platform
- Communication of information to some blog editors is tricky, particularly the division blogs
- Are multiauthor blogs the future?
